The Europe-China “Crescendo” International Music Competition is a competition unit of “Crescendo”. The competition contains four majors - piano, violin, cello and viola, allowing participants to test and demonstrate themselves. The judges will be composed of well-known Chinese and German musicians and educators. The chairman of the judges is Stephan Picard, who is a well-known violinist and professor from Hochschule für Musik Hanns Eisler Berlin. The judges mainly come from Hochschule für Musik Dresden, Universität der Künste Berlin, the Central Conservatory of music Beijing, China Conservatory of Music, Berliner Philharmoniker, etc. The winners of the competition will be invited to perform at the “Crescendo” International Music Festival.

The classical music exchange platform “Crescendo” was founded by Yao Feng, who is one of the most famous Chinese-German cellists in the world. The platform is at the forefront of classical music, combining decades of professional experience in leading European orchestras with a relentless pursuit of musical attitudes

The sudden outbreak of the pandemic in 2020 has disrupted everything. While responding to the pandemic, people are also adapting and learning to coexist with it and seeking new ways of living and learning. The “Crescendo” Online International Music Competition hopes to bridge the gap, breaking through the traditional live competitions and completing the competitions and evaluations through online.

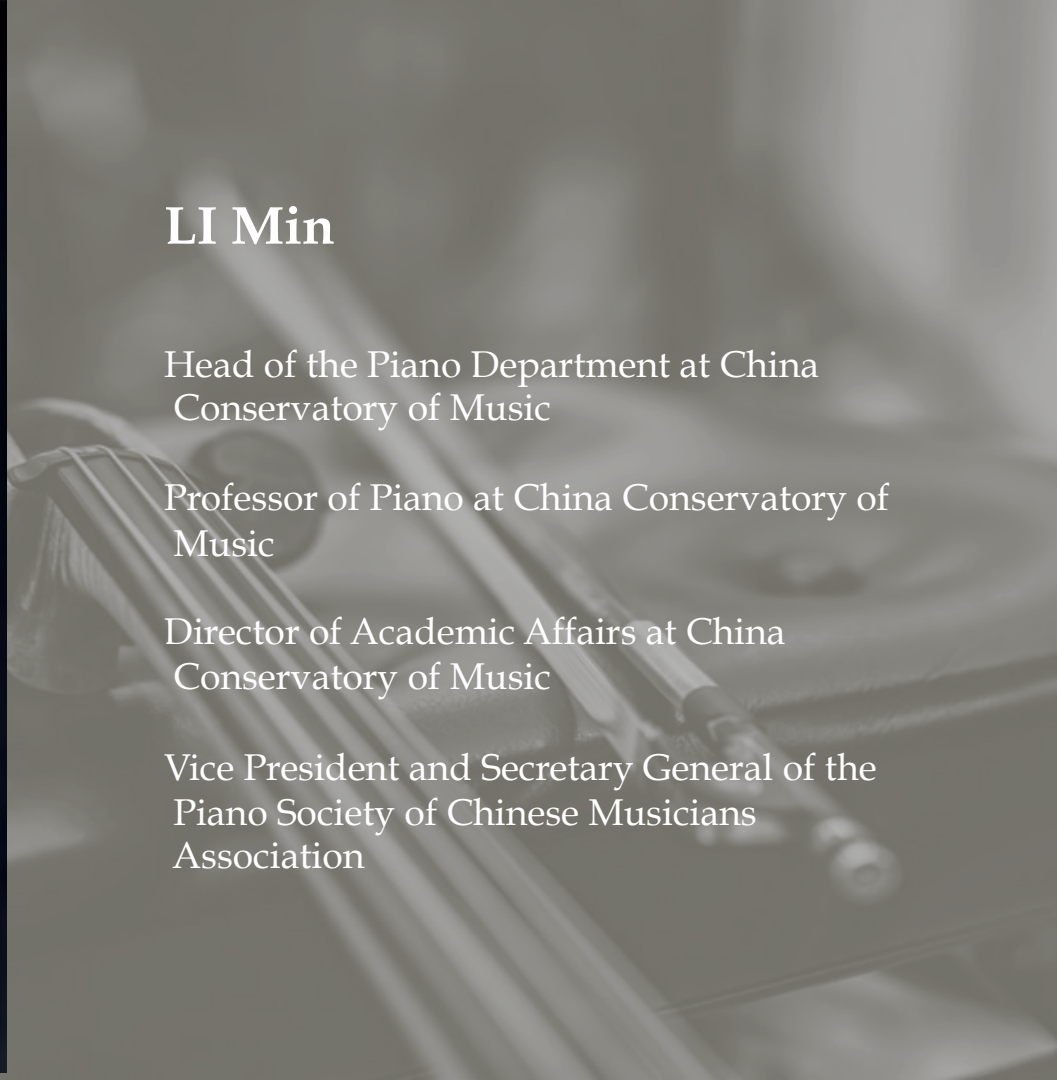

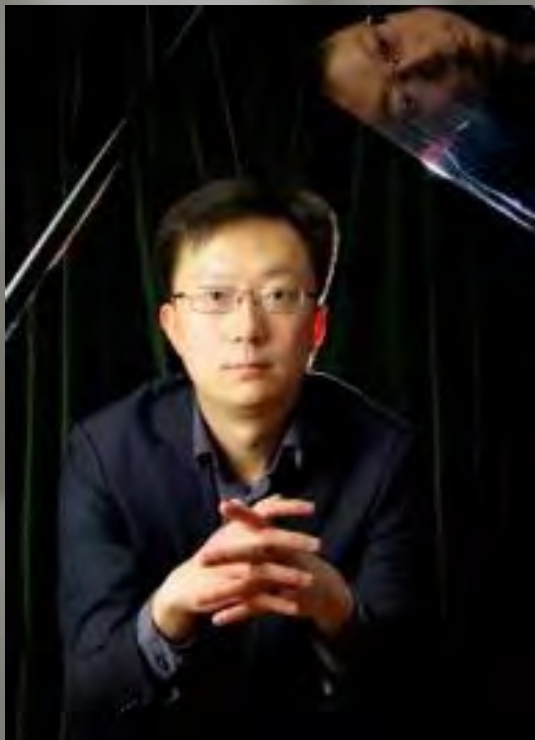

Video submission

Upload the video to an online platform (Baidu, Tencent, WeTransfer, Google Drive, Dropbox etc...), generate a link and send it to info@istitutoitalocinese.org. The file name and the subject of the email must contain the following terms: professional + group + name + Playing program.

Rules of Recording

The performance should be solo, with piano accompaniment or performance with orchestra. Total duration of the video recording is limited:

Video recordings (audio not acceptable) must be performed by the applicants and may not be edited, nor should any effects be added. To ensure that poor recording quality does not interfere with jury's ability to review the material, avoid distortion and ensure that the accompaniment is not louder than the applicant (where applicable). You will not be penalised for the quality of your video, although it is important that it is good enough to see and hear you clearly.

If the duration of the submitted Video (or total duration if more than one video) exceeds the time limits, as specified in the rules, with more than 60 seconds, the applicant might be disqualified without notice and his/her application shall be treated as null and void.

The duration of the performed piece excludes applause and going onto or leaving the stage.



Information

1. By participating in the competition, competitors automatically disown the right for any material (financial) remuneration regarding eventual publication and distribution of music video recordings on CD and DVD publications and Internet.
2. All Jury decisions are final and irrevocable.
3. The prizes will be awarded based solely on the submitted recordings. The competitors have no right to present any objections against the composition of the Jury.
4. By applying to the competition, participants automatically accept conditions from previous provisions of the online music competition rules.
